FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

In past winters, my weekends were consumed with various figure skating competitions. With wife Sue, and daughters Katie and Sarah all on Synchronized Skating teams, we were either heading to 6am practices Saturdays and Sundays, or living at arenas while they competed.

As a result, I'd never been to an Ice Race. This year, my daughters have finally packed it in, freeing up most of my winter weekends.

I headed to Minden to help out at the TAC Ice Race weekend. It was a real eye-opener. With over 100 entries, these have more competitors than any other events sanctioned by CASC. Registration was relatively quick, although there is no pre-registration, paper forms are filled out and validated, and payments are made by cash and cheques.

I was amazed at the number of people sharing cars, or running cars in multiple classes. There's as much track time as you would want. By sharing cars, this becomes a very inexpensive form of motorsports!

A few practice laps are available, then cars grid for the first race. Grid orders are random for the 10 lap qualifying races, but then previous race results set the grid for subsequent races. The track is constantly busy, with races taking 10-15 minutes each, and only 2 minutes of down time to get the next group in place.

Cars are classed based on drive-train (front, rear, and 4wd cars are all in separate classes), and type of tire (rubber, street studs, and full studs). There are separate runs for second drivers. Some of the smaller classes are combined, and will run at the same time, so the lead cars are regularly lapping the slower class cars. It makes for great racing to watch!

TAC volunteers helped with registration, gridding, starting, and timing. We provided the tow vehicle and Steward. I worked in the timing booth for much of the weekend, and it was a very busy place! Some of the early races with random grids, had over 20 competitors running, with many cars passing the finish line at the same time. We had to keep track of their order each lap, and that

was a challenge. I'd hate to have to get lap times on these cars!

Competitors were able to quickly change tires and/or drivers, and get the cars back out on the grid.

Most cars were carrying passengers: Either the co-driver, a crew member, or a spectator. I rode with TACcie Graham Tulett, in his very fast Audi. He ran at the front of the Street Stud class, and I was amazed at the car control he exhibited. We would head into the corners right on the bumper of the car in front, then both drivers would throw their cars into four-wheel drifts all the way around the corners, side-by-side, not more than 6 inches from the door of the other cars. Graham was working the steering wheel from lock to lock, at full throttle with wheels spinning, maintaining the perfect drift.

Of course there is some contact, though it is discouraged. The car behind Graham kept bumping us as he tried to get into the corners. I later heard that he was pulled aside by the Steward, and warned about his aggressive driving style. You are not supposed to use the other cars to help you through the corners!

Given the bumps that the cars are going to see, most of the cars are of an older vintage, with deteriorating body-work. There are some beautiful Mazda GTX's with turbocharged engines and 4wd, but most are subcompact Hondas, Volkswagen Rabbits, and others. This is a worthy final resting place for cars that can still run, but people may not want to drive on the street.

Hopefully next year, with my weekends freed up, I can share a car with someone. I'm expecting that my total annual budget will be less than the price of a set of race tires for my summer race car!

Did I say that most weekends are freed up? We're off to North Bay for Sue's Provincials next weekend, and Canadians are 2 weeks later. Daughter Sarah is going through withdrawal, and says she'll be back skating next year. It will still be tough to get in a season of ice racing unless I can convince them to join me!

Fellow Racers,

As the mid season weekend draws to a close I am pleased to report that, so far, we have had no major incidents except for a "soft Roll" in the first weekend of racing organised by **BARC**. The only time we have "rolled" the medic so far. No injuries and minimal damage. That weekend I was able to host my first drivers meeting on the Sunday. All racing finished in good time but laps were cut back to accommodate. Weather was very cold, with limited visibility due to snow dust.

The Second weekend was hosted by **TLMC**. Kudos to organiser Kim Bowser and her crew for an awesome weekend of racing. Both drivers meetings and Rookie school at lunch on Saturday was well attended. No incidents, and Special thanks to inter-club volunteers for helping out. A major influence to this weekend's success goes to Gianni Birel for stepping in as Clerk. His direction and influence on the day's events can only be classed as exceptional. If I could describe Gianni's Radio protocol and discipline, it would be nothing short of military in style. I even got crap for miss identifying myself! All racing finished in good time with full laps. The weather was milder with temps in the -13 range. Visibility was good.

TAC hosted the third weekend. I was wearing multiple hats this weekend as both director, organiser and Racer, talk about busy! Saturday went off without a hitch, except some lengthy tire changes due to a revised schedule. Saturday's Drivers meeting was well attended, as was the rookie school. At Sundays drivers meeting Nick Majors, the steward of the event, rose to speak of so many driving infractions the day before, namely, passing under a yellow. Then, the very first race of the day saw no fewer than 8 infractions, all passing under the yellow! Only two infractions resulted in penalties. All racing finished in good time with full laps. The weather was very mild with temps just below freezing. Visibility was good.

The track is holding up well with minimal wear in the first two events, but milder temps and an increase in the amount of full stud entries lead to a lot of

track wear on the third event. Lets hope that the track can be repaired in good order for the next event. Colder temps are coming.

The Signalling system is working well, with one exception, we do not have a spare light as one was broken on the first weekend when it was dropped out of a truck. I am currently in the process of finding someone to fix and maintain the lights as the original designer and builder had suffered some medical issues a few months ago. I have also repaired some charging issues with the battery bank.

There was also sound testing done on the first weekend by BARC but I have not seen any reports yet.

Please remember to remove the salt and slush from your vehicle before you cross the track to remove or park a trailer.

Special thanks to Doug Forbes for running the rookie school for us again this year aided by his crew of experienced racers, and to his wife Diane for running the 50/50 again this year. I believe the prizes have been over the \$150 mark each weekend.

Minutes of the November 17, 2010 meeting were moved for acceptance with the deletion of the word 'special' in reference to the Annual General Meeting by Dietmar S and seconded by Paul M.

- 1) President's report:
 - a. A letter was read from a past TAC executive in response to the Task Force report commenting on a number of items raised in the report. Permission to print the letter in Fifth Gear will be requested from the author.
 - b. The Canadian Motorsport Exhibition is being held this weekend. Any TAC volunteers would be welcome to work in the CASC-OR booth. Free admission!
 - c. TAC merchandise (hoodies, sweatshirts, toques etc.) have arrived and are available at great prices. Club members are encouraged to wear their TAC gear and help raise awareness.
 - d. Time Attack (formerly Solosprint) organizing clubs have proposed a membership and basic license special to encourage new participants and equalize the distribution of new members among the Solo clubs. An annual membership and a CASC-OR 'C''' license will be packaged for the Solo open house and priced at \$95. After some discussion, TAC will agree to participate for the 2011 season.
